Telafi Eğitim Süreci ve Kazanım Kavrama Etkinlikleri

Küresel salgın nedeniyle dünyada ve ülkemizde her alanda birçok önlem alınmıştır. Bu önlemlerden biri de 16 Mart 2020 tarihi itibarıyla yüzyüze eğitim öğretime ara verilmesi olmuştur. Ancak yüzyüze eğitime ara verilse de eğitim süreci, hazırlanan dersler, içerikler ve materyallerin EBA TV ve EBA-internet aracılığıyla uzaktan eğitimle öğrencilere aktarılması yoluyla devam etmiştir.

Öğrencilere uzaktan eğitimle verilen derslerin kritik kazanımlarının yüzyüze verilmesi için Eylül ayında telafi eğitimi yapılacaktır. Telafi eğitimi, bütün bir dönemin eğitimi değil kısmi ve hızlandırılmış bir eğitim sürecidir. Bu süreçte öğrencilerin okula uyumuna, psikososyal desteğe, uzaktan eğitimde elde edilen kazanımların ve akademik ihtiyaç durumunun tespitine, temel derslerin telafisine yoğunlaşılması amaçlanmıştır.

Telafi eğitimi için temel derslerin kritik kazanımları belirlenerek kazanım kavrama etkinlikleri hazırlanmıştır. Etkinlikler etkili bir öğrenme deneyimi sağlayacak şekilde çeşitli türde sorulardan oluşturulmuştur. Bu etkinliklerle öğrencilerin, bilgiyi keşfetme, bütünleştirme, becerileri geliştirme ve başkalarıyla paylaşmaları hedeflenmiştir.

Kazanım kavrama etkinlikleri kısıtlı zamanda gerçekleştirilecek olan telafi eğitiminde öğretmenlerin ders sürecini daha işlevsel hale getirmelerini, öğrencilerin ise derse etkin katılımını kolaylaştırarak, etkileşimli öğrenme öğretme ortamı sağlayacaktır. Kazanım kavrama etkinlikleriyle telafi eğitim sürecinin daha planlı, anlaşılır ve pratik şekilde yürütülmesi amaçlanmıştır.

Part 1 Packing information/Tips

You should find out your airline's baggage limits (dimension and weight) because most airlines get extra fees for oversized or overweight baggage and if you have an oversized or overweight baggage, you will have to pay extra, too.

- You should photocopy valuable documents such as your passport, visa, credit cards, prescriptions, etc., and keep these copies in your bags and separate from the originals.
- If you choose to exchange money in the United States, you should do this at the first international airport you fly into (e.g. New York, Chicago, Los Angeles). Exchanging foreign currency is problematic in small airports and probably, you may not receive a good exchange rate.
- You should not bring valuables such as expensive jewelry. If you lose your valuables, no one will assume responsibility.

Part 2 Clothing

You should have/bring...

- Warm weather clothing (the average June/July temperature of the area is 84°F (28°C). You may find it useful to pick one color scheme and stick to it.
- Sweater or light jacket (Building temperatures can be quite chilly due to air conditioning. Evenings can also be cool.)
- Comfortable clothes and walking shoes for excursions (such as to a baseball game). Make sure all clothing is washable.
- Business-appropriate (nicer) outfit for official meetings
- Shoes to wear with business-appropriate outfit

You should not bring...

- Food. You will not be allowed to bring any meat, vegetables, fruits, plants, or animal products into the United States. If you bring any of these, you will have serious problems with customs officers and the police.

Part 3 Arriving in the United States

On your flight to the United States, your flight attendants will give you customs forms. You have to fill out this form. As a foreign traveler in the United States with a visa, you also have to fill out a Form I-94. Together with the completed I-94, you will also have to present your passport and valid visa to border patrol officials. If you fail to present these forms or the visa, you will not be allowed into the US.

You will also need to bring an adapter for your plug-in devices. This adapter should be compatible with North American outlets. We suggest finding an adapter that is grounded.

The Milwaukee Native American Indian Festival

North America's largest American Indian festival is celebrated at Milwaukee's lakefront Henry Maier Festival Park for three days in September every year. Thousands gather in Milwaukee, USA, to celebrate the Indian culture. The preparations take months. Dance teams from all over the country practice to compete in the tribal Pow Wow dance contest. Indian craftsmen work to produce the many traditional items on display. Then, in the week before the festival, the stalls are put up and the food is prepared so that everything will be ready for the big day. During this three-day event, contemporary American Indian entertainers combine with traditional arts, crafts and cuisine reflecting the diversity and richness of North American Indian cultures.

Jeonju Bibimbap Festival

The festival is held for 4 days in Jeonju, South Korea in October every year. Thousands of people come together to celebrate a popular Korean rice dish which is called Bibimbap. It is made with rice mixed with vegetables, egg, red pepper paste and meat. The main highlight of the festival is the making and tasting of the world's biggest bibimbap. The festival includes all sorts of events, cooking competitions and performances. A variety of traditional Korean folk games to gain different ingredients for bibimbap and their locations to play, a market selling traditional crafts, local food stands, stages for concerts are all prepared beforehand. Thus, all sorts of enjoyable events, cooking competitions and performances are held during these 4 days.

Earth and Arbor Day

Arbor Day was started by Julius Morton in Nebraska in 1872. He proposed the day of tree planting as a way to repopulate his home state with trees. Today, many countries observe such a holiday. It is celebrated either the last Friday of April, or whenever the climate allows. Tree planting festivals are held and more trees are planted on this day. Earth Day was launched by Senator Gaylord Nelson Wiscon in 1970. It is celebrated every 22nd April in the USA in honor of his environmental consciousness movement. Activities include planting trees and local trash cleanups. Earth Day and Arbor Day both come to emphasize the end goal of improving our planet and celebrate hope for the future.

Sapporo Yuki Matsuri Snow Festival

Yuki Matsuri is the Japanese name of the snow festival that takes place in Sapporo, the capital city of Hokkaido Island in northern Japan every year. The event is usually held at the beginning of February running for seven days. A large number of visitors travel to Sapporo to admire the two hundred snow sculptures and ephemeral statues displayed in the city's several districts. Thousand local amateurs and foreign professionals combine their efforts and creativity to build these statues of snow and ice. Gigantic snow sculptures and masterpieces are made out of ice during the festival.

The Milwaukee Native American Indian Festival

North America's largest American Indian festival is celebrated at Milwaukee's lakefront Henry Maier Festival Park for three days in September every year. Thousands gather in Milwaukee, USA, to celebrate the Indian culture. The preparations take months. Dance teams from all over the country practice to compete in the tribal Pow Wow dance contest. Indian craftsmen work to produce the many traditional items on display. Then, in the week before the festival, the stalls are put up and the food is prepared so that everything will be ready for the big day. During this three-day event, contemporary American Indian entertainers combine with traditional arts, crafts and cuisine reflecting the diversity and richness of North American Indian cultures.

Jeonju Bibimbap Festival

The festival is held for 4 days in Jeonju, South Korea in October every year. Thousands of people come together to celebrate a popular Korean rice dish which is called Bibimbap. It is made with rice mixed with vegetables, egg, red pepper paste and meat. The main highlight of the festival is the making and tasting of the world's biggest bibimbap. The festival includes all sorts of events, cooking competitions and performances. A variety of traditional Korean folk games to gain different ingredients for bibimbap and their locations to play, a market selling traditional crafts, local food stands, stages for concerts are all prepared beforehand. Thus, all sorts of enjoyable events, cooking competitions and performances are held during these 4 days.

Earth and Arbor Day

Arbor Day was started by Julius Morton in Nebraska in 1872. He proposed the day of tree planting as a way to repopulate his home state with trees. Today, many countries observe such a holiday. It is celebrated either the last Friday of April, or whenever the climate allows. Tree planting festivals are held and more trees are planted on this day. Earth Day was launched by Senator Gaylord Nelson Wisconsin in 1970. It is celebrated every 22nd April in the USA in honor of his environmental consciousness movement. Activities include planting trees and local trash cleanups. Earth Day and Arbor Day both come to emphasize the end goal of improving our planet and celebrate hope for the future.

Sapporo Yuki Matsuri Snow Festival

Yuki Matsuri is the Japanese name of the snow festival that takes place in Sapporo, the capital city of Hokkaido Island in northern Japan every year. The event is usually held at the beginning of February running for seven days. A large number of visitors travel to Sapporo to admire the two hundred snow sculptures and ephemeral statues displayed in the city's several districts. Thousand local amateurs and foreign professionals combine their efforts and creativity to build these statues of snow and ice. Gigantic snow sculptures and masterpieces are made out of ice during the festival.
